



## Sheila Kay Adams with Donna Ray Norton & Melanie Rice Penland

A seventh-generation ballad singer, storyteller, and claw-hammer banjo player, and the mother and teacher of the eighth generation, Sheila Kay Adams was born and raised in the Sodom Laurel community of Madison County, North Carolina,



where she learned to sing from her great aunt and other notable singers. Her devotion to preserving and perpetuating her heritage is both audible and palpable. She'll be joined by her daughter Melanie Rice Penland and her cousin Donna Ray Norton, two members of that eighth generation.



## **Scott Ainslie**

Steeped in traditional music from both sides of the color line, Scott Ainslie is a renowned acoustic blues guitarist, singer, and songwriter, with expertise

in Piedmont and Delta Blues, Black Gospel, and Southern Appalachian fiddle and banjo traditions. Armed with a variety of instruments—vintage guitars; a fretless gourd banjo; a one-string diddley bow (aka cigar box guitar)— Scott brings the history, roots music, and sounds of America alive.



## **Stefan Amidon**

Stefan Amidon, a gifted singer and singing leader, leads shape note singing at the Old Songs Festival. Although he is best known as a percussionist and singer with the Sweetback Sisters, the Starry Mountain Singers, and The Devil

Makes Three, he is also becoming a hot mandolin player, and a deeply meditative old time fiddler.

## Roy Book Binder

Roy Book Binder is an acoustic guitar master, unabashedly addicted to country blues, especially Piedmont blues, in the tradition of the Rev. Gary Davis,



who took Book Binder under his wing and on the road with him back in the '60s. Since then, "the Book" has continued to absorb country blues influences, but he gives the music his own stamp, and he contributes his own songs. "The old guys who taught us how to play wanted us to keep their music alive, but I think our responsibility is to create new music in the style we were taught to communicate in." Book Binder does both.

## Bourque Émissaires

Bourque Émissaires are Benoit Bourque and Antoine Pigeon-Bourque. Benoit is a versatile artist overflowing with energy



and a contagious joie de vivre, who has been winning the public over more than 30 years. A few of the words used to describe him: charismatic, exuberant, warm, funny, limber, the band's sparkplug. Antoine started playing piano at the age of 11 and accordion at the age of 16. He has degrees from Université de Montréal, where he studied the classical repertoire for piano-accordion, and from Collège Saint-Laurent, in Montreal, where he studied tuba and accordion.



## Fern Bradley

Fern Bradley began calling contra dances in 2000 and has since expanded her calling repertoire to include square dances and community dancing. Since moving to the Hudson Valley area in 2005, she has become one of the region's

favorite callers. New dancers and experienced dancers alike appreciate her relaxed teaching style, her warm voice, and her knack for choosing dances that are just the right fit for the mix of dancers on the floor. Whether introducing novices to contra dancing or calling community and family dances, Fern loves to blend a variety of folk traditions at events designed for people of all ages.

## Joseph & James Bruchac

For over forty years, Joe Bruchac has been creating literature and music that reflect his indigenous heritage and traditions. He is a proud Nulhegan Abenaki citizen and respected elder among his people. Although his American Indian heritage is only



one part of an ethnic background that includes Slovak and English blood, those Native roots are the ones by which he has been most nourished. He continues to work extensively in projects involving the preservation of Abenaki culture, language, and traditional Native skills. His son James—author, Abenaki storyteller, cultural and wilderness educator—will join him again this year.

## **Matthew Byrne**

With parents who were both singers and song collectors and a strong family focus on sharing songs, Matthew Byrne has inherited a unique repertoire as well as a fascination with unearthing and reimagining traditional songs. But Byrne is also a student of history whose love of

traditional music goes well beyond the words and music. For him, songs are ways of understanding people before him—their lives, work, language, and worldview.



## Cloud Ten

From hot Irish fiddle tunes to driving old-time cello, from crisp trumpet fanfares to cheerful piano backup and groovy, tasteful drumbeats, Cloud

Ten sweeps dancers up into an ever-changing but always compelling sound. They play for contra dances, dance weekends, and waltz/couple dance events all over the country. The band: Cedar Stanistreet, fiddle; Donal Sheets, cello and guitar; Jesse Ball, who plays just about everything.

## Colleen Cleveland

Colleen Cleveland grew up a protégé of her grandmother Sara Cleveland, who passed to her granddaughter dozens of songs of all kinds: ancient ballads and lyrics from the Old Country



(Ireland and Scotland); songs and poems-set-to-music from the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries; song texts exchanged with members of the wider family and with neighbors; and--very occasionally--songs composed by Sara herself. Along with the songs, Sara passed to Colleen a singing style strongly reminiscent of the great ballad singers of her family's Celtic homelands.

## **Andy Cohen**

Andy Cohen is a blues musician who plays, for the most part, Southeastern music that used to be found on 78's, including blues, gospel, country dance music, fiddle tunes, monologues, ballads, classic rags, ditties, country songs, and boogies.



As well as a virtuoso finger-style guitarist, he is also an enthusiastic proponent of the dolceola, a kind of miniature (Schroeder-sized) grand piano.

## **Copley Street**


Uilleann piper and whistle player Joey Abarta and fiddler Nathan Gourley are two great young Irish traditional musicians. Their debut duo



album, Copley Street, featuring Owen Marshall on Greek bouzouki, has an undeniable chemistry and demonstrates a nuanced understanding of each other's playing. Their music includes offbeat settings of well-known tunes and beautiful pieces that seem to have languished in obscurity.

## **Ted Crane**

Ted Crane fell in love with contra dance more than 32 years ago, and is still amazed by the tradition's diversity: easily accessible to beginners, and flexible enough to challenge inventive experts. In the early '80s, he began organizing



weekly dances in Ithaca, NY, developing his own characteristic style of calling, a high-energy fusion of dry New England calls with lively, rapid patter that follows the flow of the music as it fuels the dancers. Perhaps most importantly, his dances feel good to dancers.



## John Dickson

John Dickson of Gomni believes that African drumming is the pulse of the heartbeat. It is the African Cultural way of communication or celebration in symbolizing a sad or joyous occasion. John teaches basic fundamentals of African drumming for all ages and enjoys teaching youth.

## John Doyle & Mick McAuley

John Doyle and Mick McCauley (both formerly of Solas) are exciting performers who take Irish music in daring, inventive new directions. John is one of the most talented and innovative Irish musicians—indeed, many consider him the very finest guitarist in Irish music—and in recent years he has become highly regarded as a singer, songwriter, and producer. Mick, in addition to composing, singing, and songwriting, plays accordion, melodeon, concertina, whistles, and guitar. Their music is rooted

firmly in the Irish tradition, but they do push the musical boundaries of that tradition to bring Irish music to a wider and more diverse audience.



## É.T.É

Élisabeth Moquin, Thierry Clouette, and Élisabeth Giroux (É.T.É.) offer a contemporary and dynamic vision of traditional Québec music,



combining influences from folk, jazz, progressive rock, and classical music on fiddle, cello, bouzouki, voice, foottapping, and step dancing. Together they create daring and refined arrangements of pieces from the traditional Québec and Acadian repertoires. They also compose original pieces that contribute to the continuation of francophone musical traditions in Canada.

## **Beppe Gambetta**

In a world dominated by the trends and logic of the market, Beppe Gambetta's playing and singing stand out. His is an inspired music that avoids relying solely on his technical excellence; instead, it also reveals the innermost feelings of a brilliant, playful mind that is always



exploring and innovating while staying firmly rooted in tradition. He naturally and seamlessly bridges the shores of two continents, creating a musical fusion of American roots and the Ligurian tradition, emigration songs and folk ballads, steel-string guitars and vintage harp-guitars.

## Sam Gleaves & Deborah Payne

Singer, multi-instrumentalist, and songwriter Sam Gleaves is rooted in Appalachian sounds, while his original



songs tell stories about love, the home place, working people, and current social issues in the mountains. His performances combine traditional Appalachian ballads, dance tunes, original songs, and the stories that surround the music. Singer and fiddler Deborah Payne shares Sam's Appalachian roots, as well as his passion for building community through traditional music

## **Great Gambian Griots**

Thirty-nine years ago, Alhaji Bai Konte brought the music of the kora (Mandinka 21-stringed harp) from Gambia to the U.S. This year, Great Gambian Griots, two grandsons and a great grandson, carry on that tradition in their "Follow the Footsteps" tour. Jali Bakary Konteh, whose exceptional talent gives him both flexibility and musical originality, personalizes traditional melodies with unique arrangements. Pa Bobo Jobarteh, a child prodigy who began his international career at the age of eleven, is

a hereditary Gambian Mandinka griot, with a lineage dating back to the renowned Mali Empire (1235-1670 CE). Amadou Jobarteh a child prodigy like his father, Pa Bobo,



offers infectious rhythms that invariably get folks dancing when he expands traditional rhythms with new forms.

## Ron Gordon

Ron Gordon, the Capital Region's ukulele guru, has long crusaded for all things uke in upstate New York, spreading the uke gospel to kids and adults. He has performed with St. Regis String Band, Mandolin Madness, & Festival Jug Band. He teaches acoustic music in varied



styles and on varied instruments: guitar, banjo, mandolin, and of course plays and teaches ukulele at festivals, onstage, and for private students and events.

## The Great Groove Band

Musicians aged 4–18 bring acoustic instruments and voices to Old Songs.



In five hours of focused rehearsal over three days, they experience the joy of music—learning, arranging, and performing fiddle tunes and folk songs by ear. Working cooperatively as The Great Groove Band, they prepare for a Sunday afternoon performance on the main stage. The band's transformation from chaos to harmony over three days is both remarkable and predictable, proving that music truly is our birthright! ## **Reggie Harris**

A songwriter of great depth and passion, Reggie Harris writes from a personal sense of mission that merges a world-wise point of view with a singularly hopeful stance that life, though often challenging, is filled with possibility and hope.

His songs reveal thoughts about life and love and some of the deep aspects of the human experience and cover topics from his own personal journey to world issues and history. ## Heard

Heard is a collective of musicians who bring their skills and passion for world music, jazz, and improvisation together to create irresistible grooves

set in a unique sonic tapestry. Together for a decade, their vibrant sound incorporates influences from West Africa, Brazil, the Caribbean, and beyond. The core quintet: Jonathan Greene (woodwinds), Bobby Kendall (bass), Brian Melick (drums), Zorkie Nelson (percussion/vocals), and Elizabeth Woodbury Kasius (keyboard/vocals).

## **Jamcrackers**

Dan Berggren, Peggy Lynn, and Dan Duggan have combined talents to create Jamcrackers, named in honor of the river drivers who broke up log jams. Those drivers worked hard



to find solutions, to get things rolling again, and they couldn't do the job alone. These three feel the same way about their music. With guitars and dulcimer (and other instruments), the trio showcases unique arrangements and striking harmonies as they present a diverse blend of folk and blues, ballads, gospel, and dance tunes.

## Joe Jencks

Merging conservatory training with his Irish roots and working-class upbringing, Joe Jencks delivers engaged musical narratives filled with heart,



soul, groove, and grit. He is particularly noted for his unique merging of musical beauty, social consciousness, and spiritual exploration. Blending well-crafted instrumentals and vivid songwriting, Joe serves it all up with a lyric baritone voice that has the edgy richness of a good sea-salt caramel. His performances offer musical beauty, social consciousness, and spiritual exploration.



## **Hubby Jenkins**

Hubby Jenkins is a talented singer and multiinstrumentalist (especially banjo, guitar, and bones). Having delved into his Southern roots, he follows the thread of African American history that wove itself through country blues, ragtime, fiddle and banjo, and traditional jazz. After years of busking around the country and playing with the Carolina Chocolate Drops, as well as Rhiannon Giddens's band, today he spreads his knowledge and love of old-time American music through his dynamic solo performances.

## **Ustad Shafaat Khan**

World-renowned Indian classical musician Ustad Shafaat Khan has enthralled audiences around the world with his unique concert presentations. The first artist known to attain excellence on the sitar, the surbahar, and the tabla, Mr. Khan's performances include Indian



classical and folk music on sitar, tabla, and vocal; Sufiinspired compositions; and a multi-cultural fusion of genres ranging from western classical, jazz, and rock to pop, flamenco, and African rhythms.



## **Chris Koldewey**

In addition to contemporary songs, Chris Koldewey sings many songs that have entered into the oral tradition of American and British folk music—work-songs from the

days of sail, songs of love and parting, ballads and story songs of the supernatural, or songs our forbearers might have sung "just for the fun of it." These are the stories of those who came before, built and nurtured their families and their country, and who left some of those stories in their music. Chris can accompany himself on guitar, banjo, fiddle, concertina, mandolin, and other things common to an average garage sale.

## John Kirk & Trish Miller

John Kirk & Trish Miller present fiery fiddle tunes, folksongs, and fancy footwork to audiences of all ages. John's lyric voice, good sense of humor, and versatile instrumental skills—fiddle, mandolin, and several other instruments—have earned him widespread recognition in folk and traditional music circles. Trish is best known

for her clogging, guitar, and banjo. Both of them call square dances and have taught folk music and dance programs for over two decades together.



## Jim Lloyd & Addie Levy

Musical eclectic, singer, old-time banjo great, public radio host, music teacher, bluegrass rhythm guitarist, storyteller, banjo museum curator, barber of Rural Retreat, Virginia, Jim Lloyd has musical roots that extend through at least four generations of fiddlers, guitar players, dancers, and singers from the mountains of Virginia and West Virginia



While accomplished on many instruments, he is known especially for his skills on guitar (finger-picking style) and banjo (claw-hammer and two-finger styles). He'll be joined by singer, songwriter, and mandolinist Addie Levy.

## Magpie with Rolly Brown

For more than forty years, Magpie has brought its unique sound and breathtaking versatility to audiences everywhere. From traditional songs to vintage blues, from swing and country to folk classics to contemporary and stirring original compositions,



they cover a lot of musical ground. They bring to the stage powerful voices and harmonies and excellent instrumental arrangements on guitars, mandolin, harmonica, dulcimer, and concertina. Songwriters, musical historians, and social activists, Terry Leonino and Greg Artzner will be joined by Rolly Brown, versatile—even eclectic—finger- and flatpicking guitarist.



## John McCutcheon

John McCutcheon is simply one of our most respected and loved folksingers. Multi-instrumentalist, songwriter, singer, storyteller, recording artist, producer, author, educator, and committed

grassroots political activist, he is indeed "Virginia's rustic Renaissance man" (*the Washington Post*). But it is in live performance that John feels most at home, whether in a major concert hall or theater, in an elementary school auditorium, on a festival stage, or at a farm rally. Whether in print, on record, or on stage, few people communicate with the versatility, charm, wit, or pure talent of this man.

## **Petrichord**

Petrichord is a DC/ Maryland-based trio playing traditional and original music, especially dance music of various sorts. The members are



Sophie Chang (cello), Colleen Holroyd (fiddle, feet), and Bobby LaRose (piano, mandolin, bones). Incidentally, the playing of Great Groove Band alumna Colleen Holroyd has been described as combining "the fire of Donna Hebé rt and the refinement of George Wilson."



## John Roberts

John Roberts has been singing English folk songs since the early 1960s, when he joined a local folk club in his native Worcestershire. In America since 1968, he joined with Tony Barrand to form a long-lasting duo. Singing in unaccompanied harmony, or with

concertina or banjo, their entertaining style has delighted audiences. These days, he mostly performs solo, with long-time partner Lisa Preston, or in tandem with Debra Cowan. He presents a selection of songs (music of the sea is one of his specialties), some well-known to folk aficionados and others less so.

## Roger the Jester

Roger the Jester (aka Roger the Performance Artist) keeps pretty mum on stage, but here are some words of his. "My work



is constantly changing; every venue will elicit new material. Every performance is a debut, since my work is so improvisational.... There are many events where I create something special just for that event... I recently was commissioned to perform at a wedding reception. I played an arrangement of the Beatles' All you need is Love' on the tuba, trombone, pocket trumpet, baritone, melodica, boom whacker and cymbals... [But] I will continue to juggle, spin, throw and play with all sorts of objects. Don't worry."

## Sally Rogers, Howie Bursen & Claudia Schmidt

Claudia Schmidt, Sally Rogers and Howie Bursen have been weaving their voices, dulcimers, banjo and guitars together for decades, creating an atmosphere of joy and musical lushness that audiences find irresistible. Their soaring harmonies ("blood harmony" was how one

fan described it), and instrumental wizardry blend with a wide choice of songs--their originals, traditional songs, and choice compositions of contemporary songwriters.



## Dennis Stroughmatt & L'Esprit Creole

Dennis Stroughmatt et l'Esprit Creole takes listeners on a musical odyssey into upper-Louisiana Creole culture. A vibrant blend of Celtic, Canadian, and oldtime sounds, this music bridges the gap between the contemporary Cajun styles of Canada and Louisiana. The music, preserved by families in the Ozark foothills, remains largely intact and true to the traditions that have been passed down for over three centuries. A medley of music, language, stories, and culture secreted away in the



Missouri Ozarks and once considered long lost is in fact alive and kicking. Dennis on lead vocals and fiddle; Doug Hawf on guitar; Jim Willgoose on upright bass.

## **Jake Thomas**

Jake Thomas, our favorite master signer, has been interpreting the Old Songs Festival concerts every year since 1992. His considerable skills at conveying whatever our performers



throw at him—often in unfamiliar languages, dialects, accents, etc.—with unflagging panache have made him a favorite, not only of those for whom his services are intended, but also of our entire audience. We're delighted that he's ready and willing to make the annual trek from southern Maryland up to Altamont for our festival.

## The Vox Hunters

The Vox Hunters (Armand Aromin and Benedict Gagliardi) are seekers and singers of old songs, cultivators of local (Rhode



Island) music, and chronic multi-instrumentalists. They are touted as strong tradition-bearers in their generation, and their genuine affinity for the music is evident in the emotion they draw from it. With a pair of oft-harmonizing voices tastefully garnished with fiddle, free-reeds, and tenor guitar, The Vox Hunters offer an all-natural connection to the living tradition of folk music.

## George Wilson & Selma Kaplan

A talented multi-instrumentalist and singer, George Wilson samples a wide variety of traditional and folk styles. As a fiddler, he has over 500 tunes for dancing and listening—tunes from New England, Quebec, Cape Breton, Scotland, Ireland, and Shetland. His



dynamic fiddling, strongly influenced by Cape Breton and French-Canadian styles, has been popular with contra

dancers and concert-goers since the late 1970s. Joining him this year will be Selma Kaplan on piano & accordion.

They educate as they entertain, telling stories about the music and explaining the characteristics and stylistic elements of the traditions in which they sing.

Bethany Yarrow sings music of power and of praise. She is a song keeper, an earth activist, and a student of the spiritual traditions of the Americas. Onstage, she is a mesmerizing, dancing

## Friends Remembered

**Tony Barrand (1945-2022)** was a well-known and influential singer, dancer, folklorist, historian, teacher and scholar. He is perhaps best known for his singing partnership with John Roberts, as a teacher and archivist of morris and clog dancing, and as front man in the quartet Nowell Sing We Clear. His wife of 35 years, Margaret Dale, died one week after his death.

Tony moved to the US in 1968 as a PhD student at Cornell, met John Roberts, and struck up a lifelong friendship and musical collaboration.

In the 1970s Tony founded the Marlboro Morris Ale, and in1976, Tony, John, Fred Breunig and Andy Davis, developed Nowell Sing We Clear, an annual pageant of midwinter songs and





carols, with various dance pieces and a Kentucky mummers play, which later became an annual event at Old Songs for multiple generations of families.

Despite multiple sclerosis limiting Tony's mobility in his later years, he performed until the end. He honored the shared joys, hopes, fears and sorrows of people and communities, and never let the truth get in the way of a good story.

Tony and Margaret Dale are survived by their five children and grandchildren, his brother and sister-in-law, and extended folk family.

**Bill Staines** (1947-2021) — Among his best-known songs were "River," "The Roseville Fair" and a cross-generational classic, "A Place in the Choir," which celebrates the diversity of the animal kingdom and, by implication, the human one. Countless children and adults could sing you the chorus:

All God's critters got a place in the choir, some sing low, some sing higher,

Some sing out loud on a telephone wire, some just clap their hands, or paws, or anything they've got.



Bill wrote countless songs. Many evoked the natural world, like "River," one of his best known, with its wistful refrain:

You rolling old river, you changing old river,

Let's you and me, river, run down to the sea.

Bill had the ability translate the common details of common lives into songs of uncommon beauty. There was, for instance, "The Roseville Fair," about a couple's first meeting and their enduring love. Among those who covered the tune was Nanci Griffith, who called Bill "the Woody Guthrie of my generation of songwriters." Ms. Griffith, who died in August 2021 credited Bill with encouraging her in her own career.

**Norma Waterson** (1939-2022) helped revitalize traditional music from the north of England in the 1960s. She had a dynastic influence in British folk, not only for her work with the Watersons but also through her collaborations with the singer she married in 1972, Martin Carthy, a pivotal figure in British acoustic music, as well as through her solo and joint albums and concerts with Eliza, their daughter.

Norma Waterson was born in Hull, East Yorkshire. After her parents' death she and her siblings were raised by their maternal grandmother, Eliza, who belonged to the Irish Travelers, an ethnic group sometimes referred to



as Irish Gypsies. Seven generations of the family had gravitated toward music, and Eliza sang to the children, often and eagerly. "It was in the genes," Norma told NPR in 2001.

Norma is survived by Martin, her daughter Eliza and their granddaughters.

"We thought that we'd all get old and gray and there'd be nobody left," she told *The Guardian* in 2010. "Then this new generation of young musicians came up and we all said, 'Thank God.' If people say traditional music has got to be 'like this' or 'like that,' you're going to freeze it. You can't do that with tradition. You have to hope each generation brings their own thing to it, so it keeps going forever."

**Jon Campbell (1951-2022)** was a true treasure in the thriving Rhode Island folk community, a songwriter, poet, singer, fisherman, piper, and artist. His work was particularly connected with the area of Block Island and Point Judith. His songs were a mixture of comical, quirky, thought-provoking, and poignant as summed up by a phrase from one song "We're going whaling, catch and release."


His daughter, Marina Campbell wrote "Jon's music brought him from the docks of Point Judith and Block Island to the shores of Kodiak, Alaska and into the stereos of homes everywhere in between."

His induction into the Rhode Island Music Hall of Fame in 2019 was one of his proudest moments according to the Hall of Fame, Jon summed up "his remarkable, uniquely 'Rhode Island' career in this way, 'When you live in an interesting place where interesting people are doing interesting things, all you have to do is make it rhyme.

In addition to Marina, he is survived by daughter Grasa Campbell, sister Sarah Campbell and brother Ben Campbell.

Jon's daughter finished her Facebook post with lyrics from his song "Keep on Fishin'

"You might feel bad and you might miss him. But when you're into fish you got to keep on fishing."


